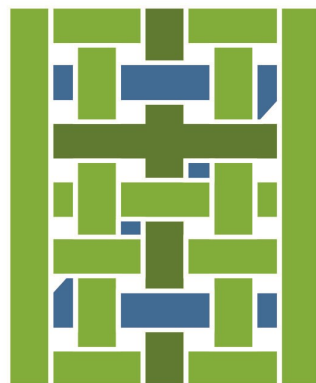

SERMON NOTES:

Dianne Krehbiel—Brief Bio

Dianne is passionate about teaching music because it empowers children in a way that other subjects don't.

Dianne is a Retired Music teacher from Oakridge Elementary, Utah and recipient of the Huntsman Award for Outstanding Educator in 2008. Dianne first fell in love with music in college before discovering an interest in teaching when she turned to studying music therapy. Once she worked with children, however, she was hooked. "They always bring a new vision to things," Krehbiel said. "I'm passionate about teaching music because it empowers children in a way that other subjects don't. It allows children to expand at the level of the heart, something we often overlook." Krehbiel remembers how, after the 2003 Space Shuttle Columbia disintegrated upon re-entry into the atmosphere over Texas, she channeled her students' sadness through a song they performed as an ensemble. "After they finished playing there was a hush in the room," she remembers. "They knew they'd created something beautiful. It's moments like those that make teaching memorable."

Dianne leaves a memorable legacy as Zion Choir Director and worship leader, shaped by joy and celebrated in grace: "To God be the Glory!"
