First Lesson

Baruch 5:1-9
A poem of hope from the school of the prophet
Jeremiah speaks of the return of scattered Israel from Babylon, but also looks beyond that to the end times when God's kingdom will be established.

Take off the garment of your sorrow and affliction, O Jerusalem, and put on forever the beauty of the glory from God.
 Put on the robe of the righteousness that comes from God; put on your head the diadem of the glory of the Everlasting;
 for God will show your splendor everywhere under heaven.
 For God will give you evermore the name, "Righteous Peace, Godly Glory."

⁵Arise, O Jerusalem, stand upon the height; look toward the east, and see your children gathered from west and east at the word of the Holy One, rejoicing that God has remembered them.

⁶For they went out from you on foot, led away by their enemies; but God will bring them back to you, carried in glory, as on a royal throne.

⁷For God has ordered that every high mountain and

and the valleys filled up, to make level ground, so that Israel may walk safely in the glory of God. The woods and every fragrant tree

have shaded Israel at God's command.

Second Lesson


Philippians 1:3-11
The apostle Paul was the pastor of many new churches. He writes in this letter about his joy to be in partnership with the Christians of Philippi. Listen to how tender-hearted Paul, sometimes a stern preacher, is with his friends as he encourages them to grow in love and knowledge.

³I thank my God every time I remember you, ⁴constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, ⁵because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. ⁶I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ. ⁷It is right for me to think this way about all of you, because you hold me in your heart, for all of you share in God's grace with me, both in my imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel. ⁸For God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the compassion of Christ Jesus. ⁹And this is my prayer, that your love may overflow more and more with knowledge and full insight ¹⁰to help you to determine what is best, so that in the day of Christ you may be pure and blameless, ¹¹having produced the harvest of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God.




