God Speaks to Us in Scripture Reading, Preaching, and Song

FIRST READING: Genesis 9:8-17

Then God said to Noah and to his sons with him, "As for me, I am establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you, and with every living creature that is with you, the birds, the domestic animals, and every animal of the earth with you, as many as came out of the ark. I establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all flesh be cut off by the waters of a flood, and never again shall there be a flood to destroy the earth."

God said, "This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations: I have set my bow in the clouds, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. 
SECOND READING: 1 Peter 3:18-22

For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were saved through water.

And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you—not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.





Remembering, therefore his life, death, and resurrection, we await your salvation for all this thirsty world.


Pour out your Spirit on this holy food and on all gathered for this feast: wash away our sin, that we may be revived for our journey by the love of Christ.

HOLY COMMUNION

All are welcome to Holy Communion at Zion. During Lent, we will use the altar rail, and invite you to either kneel or stand as you desire.

To receive communion, please come forward at the direction of the ushers, forming two lines in the center aisle. As you approach the rail on your respective side, simply go to a space that opens as someone leaves.

To receive the bread, place one hand in the other, like a manger or a bowl. Once you receive the bread, you may consume it. Gluten free wafers are available upon request.

After you have received either wine (red) or grape juice (white) in an individual cup; place your empty cup in the basket by the side aisle.

If you would like to receive a blessing only, simply cross your arms in an x form across your chest and you will receive a blessing.

During the Sundays of Lent, we will use a setting of the liturgy composed by long-time Zion organist David Chamberlin titled, "Lord, We Come to Your Table." In 1995, Zion commissioned David to compose a new liturgy. Funded by the Ruth Wells Memorial Fund, which also helped fund the Orff instruments used by the youth music program, "Lord, We Come to Your Table" debuted in 1996. The liturgy sounds as fresh and engaging as the day it was first sung, and has become a beloved part of Zion's musical heritage.

We welcome children of all ages and we welcome the sounds and actions that accompany them. Children are invited to enjoy the carpeted space in the rear of the worship space. There are activity bags, hanging on hooks along the back wall, for children to use.

Check out our Kids Station in the same area, where young worshipers can find children's bulletins, crayons, drawing paper, fidget toys, sewing and tracing boards, and puzzles.

Children are always welcome in the sanctuary, but if you desire childcare, our nursery, located downstairs, is available from 9:45 to 11:15 am.

Prayer Podium – inside the center entrance to the sanctuary is a Prayer Podium where you can write your prayer request(s) to be included in today's Prayers of Intercession. Please write them before worship begins.

All floors of the building are accessible by elevator. Special seating areas in the sanctuary are available to support those with wheelchairs, walkers, or strollers.
