

The Universal Christ

We are starting off 2020 off in a meaningful and prayer-filled way, with a book study using Richard Rohr's newest book, The Universal Christ. Pastor DanaLee Simon is leading a 7-week exploration which began on Wednesday January 8 at Zion and continues through February 19. The Universal Christ, a New York Times best seller, explores "what it means that Jesus was called "Christ," and how this forgotten truth can restore hope and meaning to our lives."



Spring is coming, and with it comes a sense of renewal and new birth. Spring may bring the anticipa-tion of getting outdoors to play golf, baseball, cycling, or tennis. We also may begin to do some spring cleaning around our homes where we look into our closets, basements, and garages to see what we have and what we may need to give away. For the month of December, Zion's weekly envelopes and loose offerings, including one one-time gifts spread across the year amounted to \$44,152.22.

For the 2019 calendar year our collections totaled \$402,679.53. Our expenditures for the year totaled \$463,840.76, leaving us with a \$61,161.23 short fall.

Our budget has remained stable for the past 2 years, despite taking on a \$250,000 mortgage in late 2018 for the renovations in our sanctuary (with monthly payments of ~\$2500/month or ~\$30,000/year). This was mostly accomplished by trimming unspent funds. We also spent \$70,000 of our rainy day savings to make the down payment on the loan, leaving us with an uncomfortably small cushion at this time.

We praise God for your generosity over the years and ask that you keep the needs of Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church in your prayers.

Report from the Treasurer's Desk

Giving to Zion

Generous contributions from members and friends of Zion help us carry out our operations and goals each year. Key points: We ask for a statement of intent each year (we are receiving these on December 8). These financial commitments help the church council set and keep to the budget for the year.

How you can give offerings to Zion:

1) Cash or checks in the offering plate. You set the frequency, from weekly to annually. If you want to use envelopes, contact the church office for a box for the year.

2) Online bill pay, via your financial institution. Set up regular contributions in your bill pay system, to be sent to Zion. There typically are no charges or fees for either you or the church.

3) Vanco or PayPal: These online systems are easy to set up and convenient to use for either one-time gifts or ongoing donations. See the instructions on Zion's web page: http://www.zelc.org/give-now.html . Though they are simple, do be aware that both of these services charge fees to Zion of about 2% of your donation. If you do choose to use them, please consider adding a little extra to offset those fees. When you sign up, you will see an option to add extra to offset ACH and/or credit card processing fees so 100% of your donation can be used for mission and ministry.

4) The Advantages of a Tax-Free Transfer from an IRA to Zion: If you are 70 1/2 and need to start taking Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) each year from your traditional IRA, you can request that a distribution be sent directly to Zion. This transfer, called a qualified charitable distribution, reduces your adjusted gross income by the amount of the transfer so may help you stay in a lower tax bracket, avoid increased Medicare premiums, etc. Instead of giving weekly donations, an annual check is generated by your IRA custodian to Zion. Talk to your IRA provider today to see if this method could be beneficial for your financial planning in 2020. There is additional information available online; one source is the Fidelity Investments page: fidelity.com/build-ing-savings/learn-about-iras/required-minimum-distributions/qcds .

5) Time and talents: There are numerous opportunities for service in and around Zion, which you can do in addition to your financial contributions. There are ongoing volunteer opportunities for counting offerings, altar guild, assisting minister service, Sunday School teaching and attendance, and choir, among others. There also are one-time events to keep in mind, like helping set up the sanctuary Christmas tree, hosting the annual holiday wine and cheese event, coffee hour sponsorship, help with VBS and other children-related events, like the Christmas program, and more. They will be noted in the bulletin and Herald, so watch for them!



Grant funding from Thrivent Financial through its Thrivent Choice® program can help support organizations you care about. Don't let Choice Dollars expire! It's you I like. It's not the things you wear. It's not the way you do your hair, But it's you I like.


The way you are right now, The way down deep inside you, Not the things that hide you, Not your toys-they're just beside you.
