### **ORGAN UPDATE**



To the left is a photo of the "swell box" in the process of being assembled. It will house all but the largest 24 of the 402 pipes that will make up the new Swell division. Five of the seven louvers to control sound volume are in place in the closed position. The new stop rail is nearing completion. In October we will install that in the console and connect it to the organ's existing stops.
