We are Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church, committed to being a loving and welcoming community of faith in Jesus Christ. As a community of God we welcome all.

But listen carefully to this summer's announcements. They embraced a unique theme in the many ways we are connecting through grace in our community and the world.

Seventh grader Berkley announced that she was selling home made slime, so that she could purchase toys for activity bags for children in Primary Children's Hospital. (she made 34 bags)

Brant Parker Graham invited us to his band's concert at Zion. The MAD (Make A Difference) Band raised thousands for the Youth Resource Center, which supports and shelters homeless and at-risk teens.

During all the "Bread Sundays," we were encouraged to join Bread for the World http://www.bread.org/

John Krehbiel asked that we consider school supply donations for Bright Minds Daycare, serving refugee children.

We were invited to address those difficult-to-talk-about-socialjustice-issues at monthly Social Action Forums.

Volunteers responded to requests to provide meals for Family Promise and the Temporary Protected Status (TPS) Journey for Justice Caravan.

Then there are the crosses. Yes, we are requesting donations for crosses, cut out of our old exterior wall, raising funds for Iglesia Luterana Cristo Rey, El Paso. The funds will support the congregation's ministry with family reunification and border ministries.

The summer is coming to an end, and as we enter back into our regular routines for fall, we would like to offer a financial update. For July & August 2018, Zion's weekly envelopes and loose offerings, including one-time contributions amounted to \$81,179, while contributions for our Capital Campaigns for Organ Fund totaled \$885 and contributions made toward the building renovations totaled \$370.

ORGAN UPDATE


Here are some photos showing progress in the Bigelow shop on the organ.



1. This is the new solid walnut stop rail, into which 68 new stop switches will be installed, replacing the original plywood one with 23 stops.



3. This is the Swell impost. It will attach behind the existing Great division (upper middle part of the organ). This is what supports the windchests on which all but 24 of the 402 pipes of the new Swell division will stand. It will also support walls on three sides and two panels of louvers in front.



2. These are the 68 stop tabs – the things the organist pushes to change the sound. They will be mounted to stop switches after they are mounted to the stop rail.



4. This is the larger of the two panels of louvers – commonly called swell shades. These are controlled by a pedal on the console, allowing the organist to infinitely vary the amount of sound coming through them.

Bigelow & Co. is eager to begin work on site, and we hope to be ready as soon as the construction in the sanctuary is complete.
