A Word from the Pastor...

Ash Wednesday is hard. It is profoundly awkward to mark one another with ashes: "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return." Every year I am taken aback by the oily black crosses smudged on the foreheads of babies and our oldest members, on the heads of young adults with their hopes and dreams, on the heads of spouses and colleagues, black crosses on those carrying in silence the burden of illness or addiction, smudges of ash marking endings that are beginnings and beginnings that are endings.

The meaning of the day is not to leave us standing in fear or shame or shock or despair, covered as we are in one another's ashes. The day is not about judging us into obedience, or trying (again) to change or to get it right.

Ash Wednesday is about putting our life and our death into God's hands. We simply take all that we can name and all that we are afraid to name; and we bring it to God. "All of this we commend to you," we pray. One poet (Jan Richardson) says:

"Did you now know what the Holy One can do with dust?

So let us be marked not for sorrow.

Let us be marked not for false humility or for thinking we are less than what we are

but for claiming
what God can do
within the dust,
within the dirt,
within the stuff
of which the world
is made
and the stars that blaze
in our bones
and the galaxies that spiral
inside the smudge
we bear. "

Ash Wednesday is about our God, who is slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. It is about our God who takes us, with whatever we bring into the day's worship, with whatever we face and whatever our path when we leave, and gives us a new way forward.

Thank you, people of Zion, for your strong response to our stewardship appeal. As we continue to grow into a cultural of generosity, and continue to connect through grace, pledges are useful to



help your church council plan programs and services for the year. We had hoped for a 100% response rate from members electing to make a financial pledge and/or committing to praying for the congregation's efforts. To date, we have received pledges of support from 66% of us—not 100% but a big increase from last year's 4% return rate. As one member noted, "We do always support Zion financially, but sometimes just forget to turn in a pledge form. Having the Statement of Intent form available was a good reminder for us to take that step. And reading the stewardship material helped us understand that specifying a dollar amount is crucial for the church council to be able to realistically plan for the year."

Thanks to your support, we ended the 2017 year \$136.55 in the black!

What's happening now? Groups are beginning work in each of our areas of emphasis.

Investing in Our Children: On March 3, Zion is holding an Interfaith Children's Choir Festival.

Investing in Our Home: A building task force has begun to

analyze building needs and to prepare a plan for moving forward. One notable change, recognizing our care for creation: insulating improvements will move us from R1.5 to R20 value.



<u>Investing in Our Congregation</u>: A communications task force also has begun to meet, to plan for upgrades to the congregation's web page, directory, and financial management systems.

We do what we can do, always focused on how we can connect in grace through gratitude. The spiritual discipline of financial support is as important as worshiping and praying and serving and singing. Look for notes in the bulletins and newsletter about specific ways you can help as we work and connect in the coming year.

Opportunity for Teens to participate in the 2018 Ulster Project

The Ulster Project is a Christian peace project for teenagers which will be held for the 33rd time in Utah in July of 2018. The project brings Protestant and Catholic teenagers from Northern Ireland to be matched with their Utahn peers for a month long program in Salt Lake City which focuses on teaching trust, tolerance and mutual respect. The structured program is a mix of fun activities, service projects and exercises led by trained counselors to help the teens develop trust in each other, particularly as it relates to the religious sectarianism which the Northern Irish experience in their daily lives.

We are inviting teenagers who are in 9th grade or are 15 years old to apply for the 2018 Project. If selected you and your family will be asked to host a teen from Northern Ireland for the month long duration of the Project. Zion has a long history of supporting the Ulster Project and we are hoping

Zion's 1980 W. Zimmer Tracker Pipe Organ Update:

The first rank (set) of brand new pipes, hand-crafted in Germany, for the new Swell division (Phase Two of the project) is due to arrive at the Bigelow shop early in February. Samples of two other existing ranks are being evaluated for tonal compatibility, and two others are ready and waiting for minor alterations in the Bigelow shop. That accounts for five of the six planned ranks in this phase, which Bigelow hopes to complete this year.



Zion youth are highly trained experts in the flocking patterns of Dodo Birds. For a small fee, they will guide these birds to the yards of your fortunate family & friends. The Dodo birds migrate to a yard for a day or two, sur-







prising their host and bringing a smile to all those who pass. The flock is maintenance free, require no food or water & is potty trained.

The flock will only be in the area from **February 16 to March 23**.

Cost is \$1.00 per bird (min. of 20)

a small removal fee of \$5 is appreciated.

However, you could insure that this flock won't visit your home for \$25.
