Swords to Ploughshares - October 5

RAWTools is a father and son team from Colorado who travel the United States with a forge and anvil, turning weapons into hand tools. They will be visiting All Saints Episcopal Church on October 5. Please join them as the duo talks about their mission and their experiences. This event will be a springboard for statewide discussions about reducing gun violence in Utah. Everyone is invited -- bring the family to see how authentic blacksmithing can turn a weapon of war into an instrument of peace.

Diaper Drive

Beginning September 24, the Coalition of Religious Communities is partnering with Zion and other faith communities to hold a Diaper Drive to help collect diapers to assist those facing homelessness in the State of Utah. Please drop off any unused, sealed diapers at the dropbox in the Narthex or outside the south entrance. These will all go to children and families in desperate need. Children outgrow the smaller diaper sizes very quickly and so there is the biggest need for diapers that are sizes 5 and 6.

Still Collecting School Supplies & Clothing

We are collecting school supplies and children's clothing to be donated to the Bright Minds Daycare, a daycare in West Valley City which specializes in refugee children. The daycare has recently seen a huge increase in children who need to attend, so supplies are crucially needed. Items welcomed include pencils, crayons, folders, lunchboxes, backpacks, and more. There is a dropbox in the narthex for donations. Sunday School has designated Bright Minds for the Sunday School offerings for the year.
